Helping Survivors Put The Pieces Back Together

WHAT IS CHANGE COURT

- CHANGE Court is an Ohio Supreme Court Certified Human Trafficking and Drug Court
- Founded in 2014 by Judge Heather Russell as part of a systemic response to the West McMicken Community Council to alleviate street prostitution on McMicken Street
- CHANGE Court differs from other specialty courts in that in addition to addressing mental health and substance disorders, CHANGE Court's model addresses the trauma innate in prostituted persons

WHO ARE CHANGE COURT PARTICIPANTS

- Persons whose current charges or have a history of charges of misdemeanor prostitution, solicitation, or loitering to solicit
- Person can have other criminal charges but must have some history of being involved in the sex trade
- Currently, half of our participants are also on felony probation in Hamilton County and other surrounding counties. Through transferred supervision, we manage their felony and misdemeanor probation together
- Participants are moderate to high risk and high need
- All of our participants have a diagnosed mental health disorder
- All of our participants are diagnosed with substance abuse disorder

THE PROGRAM

- Pre-Screening and Observation
- Clinical Assessment
- Standard client pathway starts at Crossroads Cheney Allen for inpatient treatment, then participants transfer to Off the Streets, participants go from Off the Streets to permanent housing
- Participants start out attending court weekly, they must complete IOP, attend at least three sober support meetings per week, undergo random supervised drug screening, and see a therapist once per week to address their trauma
- As clients progress, their mandatory court appearances are reduced to bi-weekly and then to once per month
- Currently, a two-year treatment model
- Record sealing upon program completion
